Sophisticated Ladies - Duke Ellington, arr. John Edmondson

This musical review of the work of Duke Ellington, Sophisticated Ladies, opened on Broadway at the Lunt-Fontanne Theatre on March 1, 1981 and closed on January 2, 1983 after 767 performances and fifteen previews. The show was unusual in that pit "orchestra" was the Duke Ellington Band, led by his son, Mercer Ellington. Also, the band was not located in the pit but was part of the action on the stage with the singers and dancers. The original cast included the great Gregory Hines, Judith Jamison, and Phyllis Hyman. This arrangement for concert band includes Don't Get Around Much Anymore, Mood Indigo, Caravan, and Sophisticated Lady.

God Bless America – Irving Berlin, arr. Erik Leidzén

Irving Berlin wrote the song, *God Bless America*, in 1918 while serving in the U.S. Army at Camp Upton in Yaphank, New York, but decided that it did not fit in a revue called *Yip Yip Yaphank*, so he set it aside for two decades. In 1938, with the rise of Adolf Hitler, Berlin, who was Jewish and a Russian immigrant, felt it was time to revive it as a "peace song," and it was introduced on an Armistice Day broadcast in 1938, sung by Kate Smith on her radio show. In 1943, the song was featured in the patriotic musical, *This is the Army*, along with other Berlin songs. It has become a standard American patriotic song.

Berlin's famous song has found favor in the world of professional sports, often performed at pregame ceremonies. From December 1969 through the early 1970s, the NHL Philadelphia Flyers brought it renewed popularity playing it before their games, as well as a reputation for being a "good luck charm" for the team. The Flyers even brought Kate Smith in to perform it live before Game 6 of the 1974 Stanley Cup Finals on May 19, 1974. It's a fact that the Flyers won the Stanley Cup that day!

PROGRAM NOTES

Russian Sailors' Dance – Reinhold Glière, arr. Erik Leidzén

This exciting work is from Glière's ballet, *The Red Poppy*, created in 1927 as the first Soviet ballet with a modern revolutionary theme. Now known as *Russian Sailors' Dance*, it is described as "Dance of the Sailors from the Soviet Ship" in the score and libretto. It is this musical selection for which Glière is perhaps best known. This arrangement was done by Eric Leidzén for the famous Goldman Band in New York City.

Salvation Is Created – Pavel Tschesnokoff, arr. Bruce Houseknecht

Salvation is Created is a choral work composed in 1912. It was one of the very last sacred works Tschesnokoff composed before he was forced by the Soviet government to compose non religious music. The work is a communion hymn based on a Russian Orthodox chant melody. The original Russian text is translated as follows: Salvation is made in the midst of the earth, O God. Alleluia.

Prelude, Siciliano, and Rondo – Malcolm Arnold, arr. John Paynter

Prelude, Siciliano and Rondo was originally written for the brass bands for which England is well-known. It was titled *Little Suite for Brass*. Scored for full concert band by John Paynter, this arrangement expands it to include woodwinds and additional percussion, but faithfully retains the charm of the original composition.

Nimrod - Edward Elgar, arr. Alfred Reed

Variation 9 of Elgar's orchestra masterwork, Enigma Variations, is subtitled "Nimrod." Nimrod was a hunter, and the German word for "hunter" is Jaeger. Elgar is depicting his friend, the critic August J. Jaeger, who was a great supporter of his music. Elgar himself wrote about Nimrod, "Something ardent and mercurial, in addition to the slow movement, would have been needed to portray the character and temperament of A.J. Jaeger. The Variation...is the record of a long summer evening talk, when my friend discoursed eloquently on the slow movements of Beethoven and said that no one could approach Beethoven at his best in this field, a view with which I cordially concurred." This music has been used in many settings outside the concert hall as a solemn, heartfelt expression in British ceremonies.

American Flourish - Robert W. Smith

This unique showcase for concert band is based on folk songs from the American experience. The melodies, including Yankee Doodle, When Johnny Comes Marching Home, and Shenandoah, have become synonymous with the history of the United States. This unusual arrangement of these tunes was composed for the Sterling, Kansas High School Band in 2007 for a performance in Washington DC.
